Will was among the first officers on scene during response to the Sandy Hook Elementary School massacre on December 14, 2012. Will has been where most of us hope to never have to go, and seen what most of us hope to never have to see. Will’s presentation will look at

what it took for the collaborative partnerships between law enforcement, education, and community partners to not only get through that deadly day, but to rebuild the school and the safe culture and climate related to it. This can happen anywhere, so we must learn from the past in order to prepare for the future. Attendees will have the unique experience of hearing a firsthand account of what worked to rebuild after this tragic event.
